Obesity prevention – a major challenge

Background

In the 21st century, overweight and obesity rank among the greatest challenges to health. They are significant risk factors for diabetes, cardiovascular diseases, muscular and skeletal disorders and cancer. According to WHO (World Health Organization), overweight and obesity are the fifth most common cause of mortality worldwide. In 2008, approx. 1.4 billion adults were overweight, of whom 200 million men and almost 300 million women were classified as obese

More than 50 percent of the population of the European Union is overweight or obese. In 18 of the 27 EU member states the prevalence of overweight and obesity is above 50%. In many European countries the number of people who are overweight or obese has doubled over the past 20 years. The number of overweight and obese people is not only increasing in affluent societies in the industrialized world, similar developments are also found in developing countries. According to forecasts, the majority of the global population will be overweight or obese by 2030.

The enormous burden of disease caused by overweight and obesity not only creates medical but also social and health policy challenges. What can health policy decision makers do to promote a healthy lifestyle? Where does individual responsibility end and political responsibility begin? Should penalty taxes and food and drink restrictions be used as regulatory measures? With the threat of an obesity pandemic looming, such public health

questions have become even more pressing in the 21st century.

Goal

The goal of EUFEP 2013 is to host a symposium on best practices in obesity prevention, to facilitate the transfer of the best available information. The event should also serve as an international scientific podium on obesity prevention.
